- Use past state and national topics as class projects.
- Complete FBLA annual topic as a culminating class project.

E-business

 Complete the FBLA topic as a Web Design class project.

• Electronic Career Portfolio

 Require all students in all classes to submit a resume.

Emerging Business Issues

- Use the event format as a classroom teaching strategy.
- Each year match the event topic to the appropriate class using the topic for a research project.

Help Desk

- Solve hardware/software issues.
- Practice solving issues within certain time frames.

LifeSmarts

 Incorporate elements of this event into personal finance.

Parliamentary Procedure

 Apply rules of order in any class to make democratic decisions and conduct efficient business.
Example: Stock Market Game research and selection of investments.

Spreadsheet Applications

 Practice completing problems within certain time frames.

Virtual Business Management Challenge

 Conduct the challenge in a management class.

Website Design

 Complete the FBLA topic as a Web Design class project.
